



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#### Background


- 2.5 billion people lack safe/sustainable sanitation.
- 84 % of Sub-Saharan African use non-piped SS (latrines, septic tanks, etc.)
- the lack of sanitation infrastructure costs nearly US\$ 5.5 billion a year to eighteen African countries
- inadequate quality and coverage of services by sanitation operators
- poor skills of operators in management, O&M of sanitation systems
- fast population growth and sprawling and uncontrolled urbanization




#### What is RASOP Africa...

- Project funded by the <u>Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation</u> (BMGF) and implemented by the African Water Association (AfWA)
- Capacity building program of sanitation operators (Municipalities and water & sanitation utilities)
- Duration :Three years (2015- 2018)

#### **GOAL AND OBJECTIVES**

Goal

To help improve urban FSM and non-sewer sanitation service quality and coverage for at least one million people in the SSA region.

- Objectives
- To adapt and spread technical guidance to promote NSS and FSM
- To build the capacity of sanitation operators in 5 countries through SOPs
- To support sanitation operators to develop strategic sanitation plans and regulatory framework
- To improve the governance and accountability of AfWA's program management team



Component 1: Development and dissemination of technical guidance and good practices to promote sustainable sanitation including NSW and FSM

- ⇒ 1 FSM toolbox adapted to the African context is available
- $\Rightarrow$  1 software to create a Shit Flow diagram (SFD) is available
- ⇒ 5 reports on baseline sanitation situation of the different cities are available
- ⇒ 5 audit reports on the performance of municipalities/utilities to conduct FSM program are available

Component 2: Building the capacity of sanitation operators through SOPs to secure funding for improving urban sanitation

- √ 140 stakeholders are trained on Faecal sludge treatment technologies among which 15 pit emptiers.
- √ 20 sanitation professional trained on how to use the African adapted version of FSM toolbox
- √ 18 staff of municipalities and sanitation utilities trained on the methodology to create a Shit Flow diagram (SFD).
- √ 75 stakeholders carried out various benchmarking missions in Dakar and Durban.











Component 3: Supporting sanitation utilities/municipalities to develop strategic sanitation plans and regulatory framework for the implementation of sustainable urban sanitation

- ➤ 5 strategic urban sanitation plans centered on onsite sanitation systems are elaborated
- ➤ 3 bankable projects on onsite sanitation are identified in each RASOP city.





Component 4: Improve AfWA project management and governance

⇒ AfWA has an effective Operational Program Team and tools for the efficient implementation of projects and programs.
