## Objectives

The objective of this webinar is to share with WASH community the strategies, including channels and tools, for better coordinating, creating and disseminating WASH key learnings likely to influence policy and operations, as a contribution to the achievement of universal access to WASH services. Better still, this will promote exchanges between experts on implementation challenges, lessons learned and impact of strategy deployment at corporate and sector levels.

Specifically, this webinar will:

- Present KM channels (software/web-based, events, etc.) and tools (social networks, webinars, etc.) developed to spread best practices in line with corporate KM strategic framework;
- Present existing guidelines and synergy efforts in place (involvement of actors and institutions at regional/national scale and beyond) to ensure WASH learnings are better coordinated and efficiently contribute to SDG6;
- Gather the opinions of sector practitioners on how funding can support KS initiatives for sustainability and tentative solutions to address identified challenges.
