• **Objective:** To develop business solutions to accelerate universal access to toilets by innovating socially, economically, technically and organizationally.

#### Specific objectives :

- Establish a business platform for private sector engagement; The connection of large and small enterprises; And ensuring close collaboration between the private, public and non-profit sectors with the common goal of accelerating sanitation for all.

- Identify the problems of sanitation to design and find ways of implementing sanitation solutions in order to preserve dignity, health and promote the well-being of populations
